1	Why and by whom was the United Nations formed?	International organisation, founded in 1945 to resolve international conflicts without war and to promote international cooperation to solve economic, social, cultural and humanitarian global challenges. Formed by 51 countries.
2	What is the role of the UN in the 21st Century?	Member countries work together to share ideas, develop policies and act to resolve issues of international importance such as world peace, the promotion of social justice, sustainable development, protection of the environment and refugees, disaster relief and counter terrorism.
3	What do governments of member countries undertake to do?	Maintain worldwide peace and security, develop friendly relations among nations, provide better living standards for their citizens, the protection of all human rights.
4	What is a human right?	<p>A set of basic rights and freedoms, protected by law, that belong to every human being in the world from birth until death.</p> <p>Every human being in the world has the right to live freely, be treated with dignity and respect. This is regardless of race, religion, sexual orientation, gender or disability.</p>
5	What does Article 1 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights state?	All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights.

6	List four human rights that are protected in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.	Life, liberty, equality, have and express their own opinions, health, an education and employment, privacy and family life, justice and a fair trial.
7	What is the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities?	It sets out what countries have to do to make sure that people with a disability have the same rights as all citizens. Signatories agree that they will do all they can to uphold their rights to dignity, fairness, equality, respect and independence.
8	How does the UN Convention try to make life better for persons with disabilities?	Stopping discrimination, improving accessibility, protecting their human rights, changing attitudes.
9	Define 'discrimination'.	'Persons being treated unfairly or less favourably because of their disability'.
10	List three barriers that might stop people with a disability participating fully in society.	Access to buildings, public transport and information, people's attitude to persons with a disability, lack of education, training and employment, social isolation.
